



## Sleaford exploration plans

MINERALS explorer Lincoln Minerals has been offered a two-year exploration licence over land near Sleaford Mere south of Port Lincoln.

The 18-square kilometre area is located to the west of Tulka from the Lincoln Conservation Park to the mean high water mark of Sleaford Bay to the south.

The Mineral Resources and Energy minister proposes to grant the company an

exploration licence over the area.

Lincoln Minerals managing director John Parker said the area was an extension of the company's Gum Flat tenement and encompassed a couple of historical graphite occurrences.

It is located within a couple of kilometres of the Uley graphite mine.

"It obviously has lots of potential for graphite," Mr Parker said.
